

Setting Timezones on Apple Devices

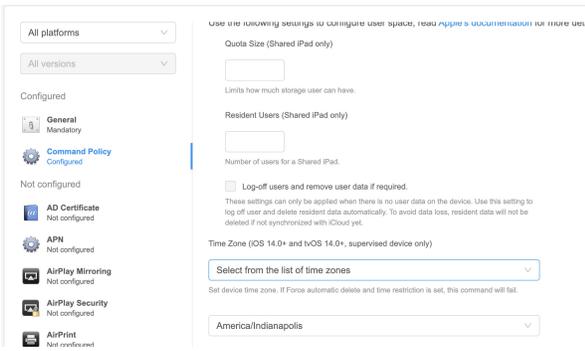
What

In FileWave 14.1+ you are able to make command policy profiles for iOS (14+ supervised) and tvOS (14+ supervised)

When/Why

Setting the timezone can help a user with their localization settings.

How

Please remember, Command Policy profiles are not persistent. Meaning a user could change it at anytime after this command has been received, but the command policy does re-apply periodically. So, it is not a "restriction" per se.
